East River Employees Committee and CoBank Matching Grant to Bethel

This summer, East River Electric Power Cooperative’s employees committee contacted Bethel Foundation about the impact COVID-19 had upon Bethel Lutheran Community. Rosie Jamison, Development Director, provided information to Sam Anderson as chair of the East River employees committee about increased costs incurred, reduction of resources with fundraising events canceled, and the hardship upon residents and their families during quarantine. This was shared with the employees committee and Bethel was chosen as a recipient for the CoBank Sharing Success matching grant program.

Bethel Foundation was one of four local organizations to receive a gift. \$3,250 was received from East River Electric Power Cooperative and a matched gift of \$3,250 from CoBank’s Sharing Success program for a total gift of \$6,500.

“This donation speaks volumes to our residents, families and staff of the support and compassion East River Electric Cooperative employees have toward our ministry of care

in the community. We greatly appreciate and are humbled by their and CoBank’s generosity, support, and interest in helping to enhance Bethel,” Jamison said.

During the November Bethel Lutheran Home Foundation Board of Directors Meeting, directors voted to use these donations toward funding a nearly \$60,000 nurse call and integrated alarm technology system. This enhancement will allow for more staff efficiency and availability for resident care, improved tracking for required reporting, and resident safety through multiple alarm system integration. Currently, generous donors have given gifts to cover over 50% of the system costs. This will help toward additional funding needed to purchase and implement the system.

New Generator Installed at Bethel

In August we were glad to secure a new/gently used 200KW generator. The new generator was expertly placed on the existing generator pad by Amert Construction Company. This has very few hours on it and was used previously to supply emergency power to a major data center provider.

Rick Barger, owner/operator of Barger Electric spent a week dismantling the old generator shed, removing the old generator, preparing the pad, trenching the new wiring into Bethel, and installing the new transfer switch. This project has been long overdue for a dependable backup for power.

The old generator was built in 1971 and had outlived its useful life. In addition, it could no longer be repaired since parts were no longer available.

Thank you to Rick Barger for coordinating the project and to local businesses Barger Electric and Amert Construction for their capable and timely work with us. It is good to have this dependable power backup power for our facility.

Give the Gift of Grain

Bethel Lutheran Home and Foundation are a member of Lutheran Planned Generosity of South Dakota. As a member we invite you to consider making a non-cash gift of grain in support of Bethel and others.

“Honor the Lord with your substance and with the first fruits of all your produce.” ~ Proverbs 3:9

If you farm, your crops are your life and the livelihood for which you work so hard. You nurture them from the time you plant until the time you harvest. Sharing your gifts of grain to support the ministries you care about most – including the Bethel Lutheran Community and Foundation – is a meaningful way you can share your harvest with others.

Here is how it works: As a producer, you can make a gift of grain or livestock with your unsold inventory. Upon receiving notice of your intent to make a gift, LPGSD will establish an account at the appropriate elevator or sale barn. We will distribute the sale proceeds to Bethel according to your wishes. A gift of grain can be used as an outright gift to the Bethel Community or Foundation, or to establish/grow a donor advised fund.

Why should I make a gift of grain? What are the benefits? Using stored commodities or unsold inventory to make a gift maximizes the benefit to Bethel while reducing taxable income. No income is recorded on a gift of grain, but production costs remain as part of your deductible expenses. Here is an example:
